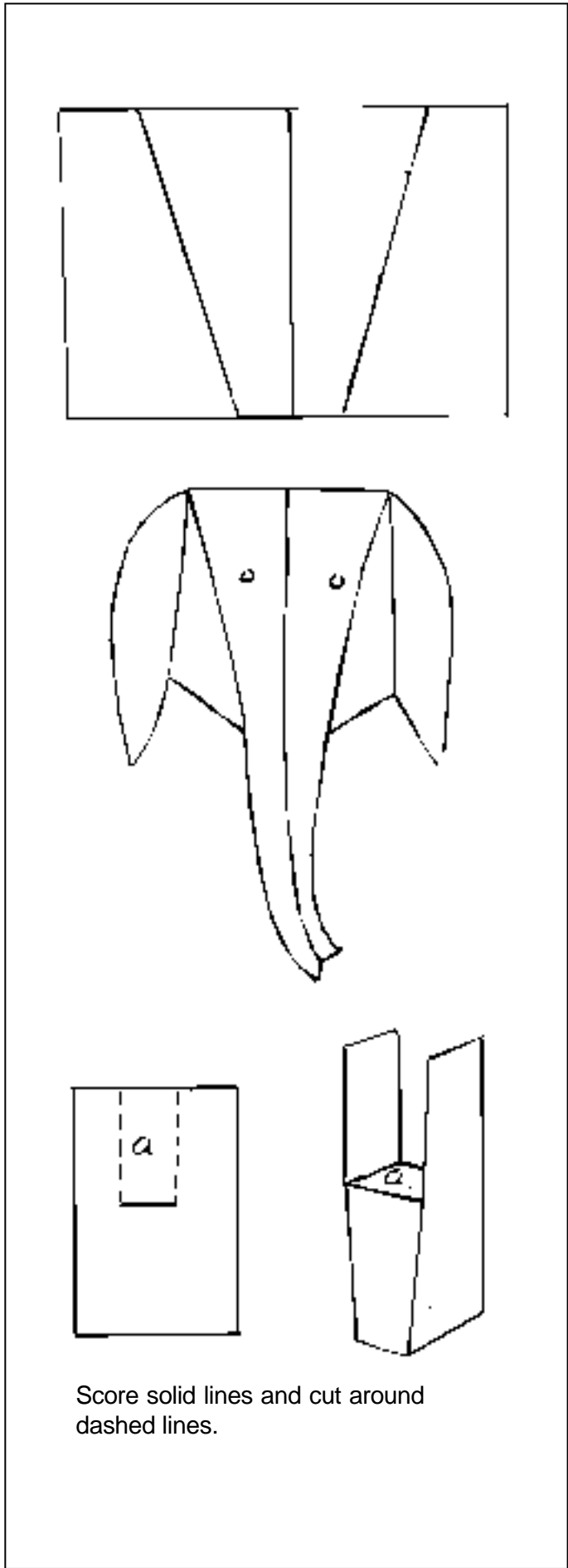
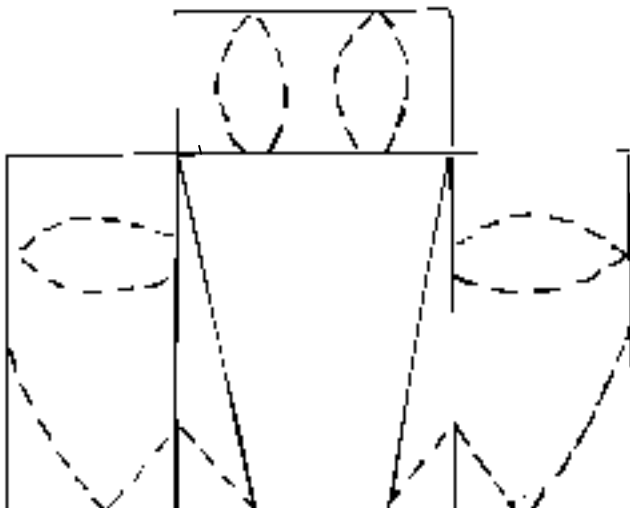


Animal Masks



Design masks like those shown using animal or human forms for inspiration. Identify factors such as the shape and position of the ears, structure of the face or snout, and any other important features. Make the basic shape for the mask from card or paper formed into a cube or cylinder. Fringe, cut and score the card to add character and form to the mask.



Score solid lines and cut around dashed lines.

Costume

Make paper costumes as an extension of making masks. Sometimes only a suggestion of a collar, hat or coat, is needed to convey an idea. Children can then use their imagination and place greater reliance upon gesture and other forms of expression.

Costumes made with brown paper as those shown may be decorated with cut paper and painted to represent specific characters.
