

Life Mask

You will need

Mod-Roc
Vaseline
Hair band
Bin liner and clothes peg

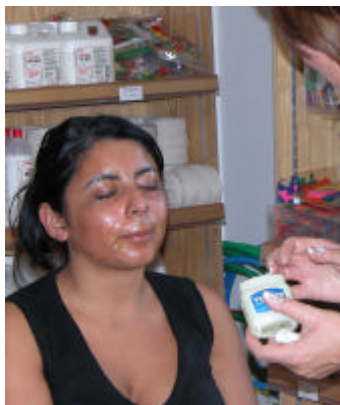
Materials for Decorating

Pipe Cleaners
Egg Cartons
Feathers
Glitter
Foil
Tissue Paper
Glue
Scissors
Paint & Brushes



Cover the person who is having the mask made with an apron or bin liner (use a peg to fasten it about the neck).

Hold hair back from the forehead with a hair band or clips. Cut Mod-Roc into strips about 1"-2" long but no longer than 4".



Cover the face entirely with Vaseline.

Dip each strip in water gently drawing off the excess by pulling down the strip.



Build up a framework by following the shape of the face and the main features.

The edge of the face or the nose is a good place to start.

When working with children leave plenty of space around the eyes, mouth and nostrils. The gaps can be filled with mod-roc later.

Under no circumstances cover the eyes, nose and mouth!

After three layers the mask can be removed - should take about 10 minutes.

Remove the mask by gently pulling from the forehead down, it helps if the person wiggles their nose.

Extra detail can be added using mod-roc or glue materials on after the mask has dried. Make holes with a bradawl to attach ties.
